### WHO'S NEWS DIDI?

Founded in 2020, <u>Via News Didi</u> is a **teacher-led, social enterprise** on a mission to: empower students to become responsible consumers and innovative creators of media, for a better tomorrow!

#### As teachers, we saw that:

- a) our students consume A LOT of media and often struggle to process this information
- b) our students consume problematic content that has a terrible <u>impact on</u> their behaviour and mental health
- c) students have <u>huge potential to</u>
  <u>create inspiring media</u> magazines,
  podcasts, comics and more!

### HOW WILL WE MAKE WRITING COOL?

We turn students into reporters, designers, journalists and then let the magic unfold...

### Students write about things that matter to them.

We've had students write about increasing prices in the school canteen, why school should start late and even a review of school furniture!

### No grades, just real feedback from real people

Writing for a publication and people gives purpose to students' writing and builds their investment in the writing process.

#### We use journalism as a tool to enhance writing

Students interview people around them and conduct research, which turns out to be far more interesting than writing an essay.

### Getting published is a game changer for students' confidence

Seeing their name printed in a publication read by their peers often makes students want to write more!

### OUR IMPACT

In 2024, **213 students from 19 schools** worked on a student-led publication as part of the Young Writers Program (formerly known as the Editorial Board Training Program)




### HOW DOES THE PROGRAM WORK?




We start with a 2 day, in-person writing summit where students turn into reporters, storytellers and designers!
